



Point Loma Nazarene University School of Theology

The PLNU School of Theology and Christian Ministry provides office space for the department's professors and staff as well as public spaces for interaction with students. The facility has been designed to encourage the interaction between students and faculty. A large multi-media classroom can serve as an informal dining venue and meeting room. Large common spaces with informal seating were incorporated into the plan instead of corridors. An operable glass wall opens the conference room to the lobby creating a larger space for entertaining. The building was designed to incorporate a large stained glass window which provides the religious symbolism appropriate for the department. As a religious affiliated campus, the building is situated at the main hub of the campus circulation pattern to reinforce the department's significance to the school. This location required the building to fit on a tight site and be partially attached to an existing building.
