The Love Library expansion project was approached with tremendous care, sensitive to the campus architecture and the library's very visible and central location. Its striking, award-winning design delivers both function and form. The addition provides 130,000 square feet of new space for special resources, general reference, administration, special collections, circulation division, current and bound periodicals, and reader stations.

The Electronic Media Center is equipped with state-of-the-art media equipment and is set up to be flexible and accommodate new equipment and future technologies. The program and spaces include:

- Small group listening rooms
- Division head office
- Supervisor's office
- Workroom
- Mediated room
- Production room
- Musical resources
- Library graphic services

26,000 assignable square feet of space within the existing library was remodeled to house microforms and newspapers, central processing, the science division, government publications, general collection, and a majority of the total reader stations.

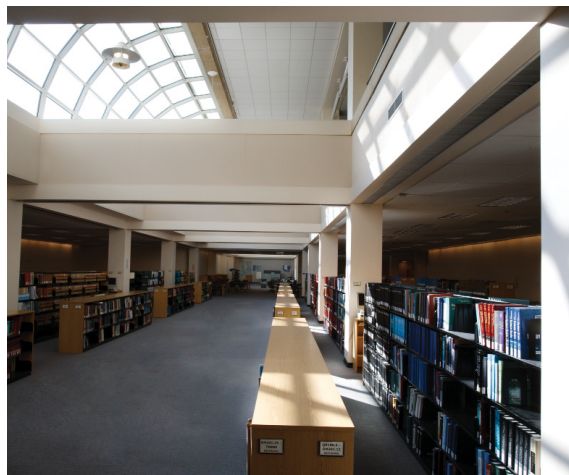
