



University of San Diego Student Life Pavilion

The Student Life Pavilion was commissioned to nearly double the size of the existing student university center. The existing facility is 76,000 square feet and the new student life pavilion is approximately 75,000 square feet.

The original University Center Expansion was carefully designed in the 1980s by Architects Mosher Drew to conform to the 16th Century Spanish Renaissance architectural style of the campus. The expansion and renovation was designed by Hom+Goldman Architects in association with Architects Mosher Drew. Architects Mosher Drew worked very closely with Hom+Goldman, the designer of record. Hom+Goldman is a specialist in university centers, while Architects Mosher Drew is the original building designer, experts in Spanish Renaissance design, and shared a long term relationship with the University of San Diego.

This comprehensive social center includes a state of the art university bookstore, food service and facilities for student organizations. With all of the functions under one roof, the student center operates as a social and commercial center for the students and faculty. Other program spaces included in the design are a recreation / entertainment area with faculty dining, women's center, university ministry facility, lounge space, media center, computer services, and art exhibition space.

The Student Life Pavilion was certified LEED Gold in May 2011.
